



Commissioning Pennant on Navy Ships

The commissioning pennant has for centuries been the symbol of a man-o'-war.

It is believed to date from the 17th century when the Dutch were at war with the English. Dutch Admiral Maarten Harpertszoon Tromp hoisted a broom at his masthead to symbolize his intention to sweep the English from the sea.

This gesture was answered by British Admiral William Blake, who hoisted a horsewhip indicating his intention to chastise the Dutch.

The victorious British thus set the precedent for a long, narrow commissioning pennant to symbolize the original horsewhip as the distinctive symbol of a man-o'-war.

The modern U.S. Navy commissioning pennant is blue at the hoist with a union of seven white stars and a horizontal red and white stripe at the fly.

USS CANOPUS (AS 34) The Second Ship of the Fleet to Bear the Name

Her keel was laid on 2 March 1964 and she was launched 12 February 1965. Mrs. Earl L. Sackett, wife of the World War II Commanding Officer of the first CANOPUS (AS 9), broke the traditional bottle of champagne in her role as sponsor.

CANOPUS was commissioned on 4 November 1965 with the Honorable Graeme C. Bannerman, Assistant Secretary of the Navy, as principal speaker.

After a short outfitting period, CANOPUS sailed for the Caribbean on 7 January 1966 for shakedown training at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. She then returned to Charleston for final loading and outfitting prior to assignment to Cooper River FBM Replenishment SITE IV on 24 June 1966 with Submarine Squadron EIGHTEEN.

On 24 September 1966, CANOPUS deployed from Charleston. Arriving in Rota, Spain, on 10 October, CANOPUS relieved USS HOLLAND (AS 32) and reported to Commander Submarine Squadron SIXTEEN for duty. While on site, CANOPUS accomplished more Polaris refits than any other submarine tender in a comparable length of time.

CANOPUS was relieved at Rota, Spain, by HOLLAND on 20 April 1968 and sailed to Bremerton, Washington, for an extensive overhaul period.

Upon completion of the overhaul, CANOPUS sailed for Holy Loch, Scotland. During May 1970 she relieved USS SIMON LAKE (AS 33) in Holy Loch and reported to Commander Submarine Squadron FOURTEEN for duty. CANOPUS was again relieved by HOLLAND in November 1975 and returned to Charleston for her second overhaul period.

CANOPUS returned to Rota, Spain, in December 1976, where she relieved SIMON LAKE and began a distinguished tour of service for Submarine Squadron SIXTEEN. In June 1979, CANOPUS disestablished SITE II at Rota and, without skipping a beat, resumed operations at Naval Weapons Station, Charleston, South Carolina, relieving SIMON LAKE. CANOPUS continued to serve with distinction as a unit of Commander Submarine Squadron EIGHTEEN until November 1983.

In January 1984, CANOPUS once again entered Charleston Naval Shipyard for an extensive overhaul and conversion period. CANOPUS returned on line in March 1985. In August 1985, CANOPUS relieved SIMON LAKE at SITE VI, Naval Submarine Base, Kings Bay, Georgia. As the resident tender at SITE VI, CANOPUS provided the repair and support services necessary to keep the assigned submarines of Squadron SIXTEEN on station and ready at all times.



THE SHIP'S EMBLEM

The ship's emblem represents, in symbolic form, the character of the ship. The CANOPUS emblem is a shield signifying the ship's defensive and protecting function as opposed to the aggressive cutting edge of a combatant.

The Greek ship and the star cluster represent the Agro Navis constellation in which the star CANOPUS resides. The big star connecting the scroll and the shield is CANOPUS. Flying through the void of space beside the constellation is the POLARIS missile guided and watched by the helmsman, the big star.

The dolphins above the crest are symbolic of our primary mission to support and tend the submarine force. The crossed rifles, encircled, recall the heroic stand of the crew of our namesake, USS CANOPUS (AS 9), on Bataan.

The motto set in a banner at the bottom pledges our dedicated readiness to serve in the CANOPUS tradition of determined excellence.

CANOPUS bears the name of the Pilot of Menelaus, King of Sparta. His name was given to the town in Egypt where the legend holds that he died. After CANOPUS died, he is said to have been transformed into a star.

The star CANOPUS is a yellowish-white star in the southern hemisphere and the second brightest star in the sky. Only Sirius is brighter. CANOPUS can be found in the constellation Carina, a part of the older Argo Navis or "Ship" constellation, estimated to be 100 light years (or 600 trillion miles) from Earth. CANOPUS can't be seen from north of the latitude of Florida.



VICE ADMIRAL GEORGE W. EMERY UNITED STATES NAVY

COMMANDER SUBMARINE FORCE U.S. ATLANTIC FLEET

COMMANDER SUBMARINES ALLIED COMMAND ATLANTIC

Vice Admiral George W. Emery is a native of Springvale, Maine. He is a graduate of the United States Naval Academy with the Class of 1963 and qualified in submarines in July 1966.

He has served in five nuclear submarines and commanded USS GROTON (SSN 694) and USS OHIO (SSBN 726)(GOLD).

His tours of duty have included assignment as Division Officer in USS ANDREW JACKSON (SSBN 619)(BLUE); Instructor and Division Director, Naval Nuclear Power School, Bainbridge, Maryland; Engineer Officer, USS HAMMERHEAD (SSN 663); Naval Nuclear Propulsion Examining Board, U.S. Átlantic Fleet; Executive Officer, USS GLENARD P. LIPSCOMB (SSN 685); duty on the Staff, Director, Division of Naval Reactors, Department of Energy, Washington, D.C.; Chief of Staff to Commander Carrier Group SEVEN (USS KITTY HAWK and USS CONSTELLATION Battle Groups); Deputy Director, Strike and Amphibious Warfare (OP-74); Executive Assistant and Naval Aide to the Under Secretary of the Navy, and subsequently, to the Secretary of the Navy.

After selection to flag rank, Vice Admiral Emery was assigned as Director, Total Force Programming/Manpower Division (OP-12) and subsequently as the Assistant Chief of Naval Personnel for Military Personnel Policy and Career Progression (PERS-2). Vice Admiral Emery commanded Submarine Group FIVE in San Diego prior to his appointment as Commander Submarine Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit (five awards), Meritorious Service Medal (five awards) and several other individual, unit and service awards. Vice Admiral Emery is married to the former Patricia Lillian Kershaw of Sanford, Maine. Their son Robert, an Army Captain and Apache helicopter pilot, commands Alpha Company in the 5th Battalion of the 501st Aviation Regiment at Fort Hood, Texas.



REAR ADMIRAL WINFORD G. "JERRY" ELLIS UNITED STATES NAVY

COMMANDER SUBMARINE GROUP TEN

Rear Admiral Winford G. "Jerry" Ellis was born in Cleveland, Tenn. and raised in Fort Myers, Fla. After attending Georgia Tech for one year, he entered the U. S. Naval Academy, graduating in 1964. Following nuclear power and submarine training, he reported to USS CATFISH (SS 339) in San Diego, where he served as Weapons Officer and aualified in submarines.

In October 1967, he reported to USS SNÓOK (SSN 592) and served in various Engineering billets and as Operations Officer. In January 1970, he reported to Nuclear Power School at Mare Island, Calif, where he served as Director, Enlisted Department, until April 1972. After being selected for the Chief of Naval Operations Scholars Program, he attended the Sloan School of Management at M.I.T., receiving a Master of Science degree in May 1974. He then served as Executive Officer aboard USS BILLFISH (SSN 676) until November 1976. He was then assigned to USS ANDREW JACKSON (SSBN 619)(BLUE) as Executive Officer.

Rear Admiral Ellis served as Commanding Officer, USS ULYSSES S. GRANT (SSBN 631)(BLUE), from February 1979 until June 1981. During this tour, he conducted Post Overhaul Shakedown Operations and strategic deterrent patrols out of Holy Loch, Scotland. He relieved as Prospective Commanding Officer of USS CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI (SSN 705) in August 1981, and was the Commissioning

Commanding Officer.

After completion of the Post Command Course at the Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island, Rear Admiral Ellis reported to Washington, D.C., where he relieved as Head, Submarine Nuclear Power and Strategic Weapons System Enlisted Manning (NMPC-403) in July 1983. Following this tour of duty, he reported in May 1985 to the staff of Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet as the Senior Member of the Nuclear Propulsion Examining Board. He then commanded Submarine Squadron 6 from July 1987 until February 1989, after which he served as the Chief of Staff, Commander Submarine Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet from March 1989 until June 1991. Prior to assuming his current duties, he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Military Application, U.S. Department of Energy from July 1991 to September 1993.

Rear Admiral Ellis has been awarded the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit (three awards), Meritorious Service Medal (three awards), Navy Commendation Medal, Navy Achievement Medal and Navy Unit Commendation. Rear Admiral Ellis also holds the Navy Expeditionary Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, National Defense Service Medal with one bronze star, the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, Vietnam Service Medal with three campaign stars and the Navy Expert

Rifleman Award

Rear Admiral Ellis is married to the former Rosemary Kreisl of Hazleton, Penn. They have three children: Chris, a high school senior; Kevin, a graduate of Florida State University; and Karri, a recent graduate of Mary Washington College.



CAPTAIN LYLE D. MEIER UNITED STATES NAVY

COMMANDER SUBMARINE SQUADRON TWENTY

Captain Lyle D. Meier is from San Jose, California and is a 1968 graduate of the United States Naval Academy. Immediately after graduation, he attended the University of Arizona on an Atomic Energy Commission Fellowship and , in January 1970, was awarded a Moster of Science Degree in Nuclear

Engineering.

Following a 4 month tour on USS VOLADOR (SS 490), Captain Meier entered nuclear power training in May 1970. He served in USS NAUTILUS (SSN 571) from May 1971 to April 1975, qualifying in submarines. Captain Meier attended the 6 month Submarine Officer Advanced Cource at Naval Submarine School, Groton, Connecticut where he received the LY. Spear Foundation Award as the class honor man. Following graduation in September 1975, Captain Meier reported to USS FLYING FISH (SSN 673) where he served as Engineer Officer until May 1979, completing deployments to the North Atlantic, Mediterranean, North Pole, and a regular overhaul.

From June 1979 to August 1981, Captain Meier was assigned to the Division of Naval Reactors in Washington, D.C. He served as Executive Officer of USS ARCHERFISH (SSN 678) from September 1981 to March 1983 and of USS FINBACK (SSN 670) from March 1983 to January 1985. Following Prospective Commanding Officer training, Captain Meier commanded USS SKIPJACK (SSN 585) from July 1985 to July 1988. Under his command, SKIPJACK completed major deployments to the North Atlantic, Mediterranean, South America, and entered her 30th year of commissioned service.

Following TRIDENT Prospective Commanding Officer training, Captain Meier served as Commanding Officer of USS FLORIDA (SSBN 728)(BLUE) from December 1988 until Febuary 1991, completing four strategic deterrent patrols. During his tour, FLORIDA earned two Battle Efficiency E Awards and received the Marjorie Sterret Battleship Award, emblematic of the top ship in the Pacific Fleet. He then served as Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics and Management on the staff of Commander Submarine Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet from March 1991 to August 1993. During his tour, Captain Meier also attended the Fall 1992 Program for Senior Executives at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Captain Meier is married to the former Susan Wuss of San Jose, California. They have two children -David is a recent mechanical engineering graduate from Virginia Polytechnic Institute, and Jennifer is

a sophomore at Virginia Polytechnic Institute majoring in interior design.



CAPTAIN RONALD B. GLOVER UNITED STATES NAVY

COMMANDING OFFICER

Captain Ronald B. Glover, a native of Greenville, South Carolina graduated from Purdue University in June 1972 under the Navy Enlisted Scientific Education Program. He subsequently attended Nuclear Power Training in Bainbridge, Maryland and West Milton, New York.

In November 1973, following completion of Submarine School in New London, Connecticut, he reported to USS LAPON (SSN 661) where he served as Reactor Controls Assistant and Communicator. In January 1976, he reported to the S1W Prototype in Idaho Falls, Idaho where he served as Leading Engineering Officer of the Watch and Staff Training Group Supervisor.

After completing Submarine Officer Advanced Course in New London, Connecticut, Captain Glover served as Engineering Officer in USS JOHN C. CALHOUN (SSBN 630)(BLUE). In February 1982, he reported to the staff of Commander, Submarine Group SIX in Charleston, South Carolina as Engineering Training Officer.

Captain Glover reported to USS HENRY L. STIMSON (SSBN 655)(BLUE) as Executive Officer in June 1984, and after completion of his tour, he reported to USS BILLFISH (SSN 676) where he served as Commanding Officer from April 1988 to March 1991. In April 1991, he reported to Naval Nuclear Power Training Unit, Charleston, South Carolina, where he served as Commanding Officer until January 1994. He is entitled to wear the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal with two gold stars, the Navy Achievement Medal, the Good Conduct Medal and the Humanitarian Service Medal.

Captain Glover is married to the former Charlotte Fuqua of Livingston, Montana. Son David is an Ensign in the Navy attending Submarine School, daughter Kristy works and resides in Boston, Massachussettes, son Christopher resides in Davis, California and daughter Michele is a junior at Savannah College of Art and Design in Savannah, Georgia.

STORY OF THE ORIGINAL CANOPUS (AS 9)

The first CANOPUS was originally built as a merchant ship but acquired by the Navy, converted into a submarine tender and commissioned at the Boston Naval Shipyard on 22 January 1922. CANOPUS was assigned to the Asiatic Squadron with six World War I class submarines, taking up residence in Manila. CANOPUS spent those pre-war years showing the flag during cruises up and down the China coast.

Early December 1941 found CANOPUS leaving a yard period which had given her more anti-aircraft guns and some light armor. The decision was made to keep one submarine tender to maintain our subs as far forward as possible. The record of CANOPUS as a capable ship, a little older and slower

than the other tenders, made "The Old Lady" the choice for the Phillippines.

The Japanese force, triumphant everywhere, began to close in on the American forces in the Phillippines. CANOPUS, under command of Commander E. L. Sackett (later Rear Admiral), sailed for Marivales Bay on the tip of Bataan on Christmas day 1941. On December 29, she received extensive bomb damage. The bombs had destroyed all supply records. For the duration everything onboard was free. If something was available, anyone in need could get it. Her storerooms were thrown open to every request, and any tiem not in stock was improvised.

The bombing became more severe. To protect the ship, she was given a list and the crew burned smudge pots during the day, giving the appearance of a burned out hulk. At night, all the CANOPUS shops worked full blast to repair the local craft and equipment. Crewmembers took part in the ground fighting as a hostily formed naval battalion. Under command of the Executive Officer, "Hap" Goodall, CANOPUS launches were converted into miniature gunboats (the "Mickey Mouse Battle Fleet") which

attacked positions along the shore line.

Through February and March 1942, CANOPUS stuck it out in her bomb-thrashed anchorage. As a hospital, machine shop, communications center, supply store and USO, she was all things to all forces fighting on Bataan. However, the overwhelming enemy forces could not be held off forever. As the ground forces fell back on Bataan, it was decided that the end was near and anything of any use to the Japanese would be destroyed. On 10 April 1942, CANOPUS was backed into deep water under her own power and was laid to rest by her own men.

CANOPUS was gone but part of her remained. Her spirit lived on in her crew, who joined the American forces for the last-ditch fight for Corregidor. Her unsinkable spirit and courage are both a legacy and a proud tradition carried forward today by USS CANOPUS (AS 34).


