Items you may want to look at while at the reunion:

1. **Command History** documents for the years you were onboard.

Re-live where the Canopus was; what subs and other ships we serviced; and who were the VIPs that came onboard for a visit.

2. The Association has two complete sets of **BLUEPRINTS** of the ship: **General Plans** (17 sheets) and **Contact Plan Booklet** (72 sheets). Find your workspaces, your bunk and where you hung out with your buddies.

The Weapons and Periscope Handling plan is of particular interest and is this year's reunion freebie. Be sure to pickup one up on your way back to your room.

3. The Association has all four **Cruise Books** that were made. See if there is one for your service time and then try to find your picture.
4. We have an amazingly collection of the ship's newspaper *The Helmsman* and the *Canopus Star*. Be sure to check out the issues for the time you were on board.
